

Check to see if the word is the specific name of a person, place, holiday, product, day of the week, or month. These words are **proper nouns**.

Remember all proper nouns start with a **capital letter**.

Thanksgiving is the name of a holiday, so it is a proper noun.

Asia is the name of a place, so it is a proper noun.
