

Create an example for each given keyword.

For example, Paul has 4 books and Anne has $\,3$ books more than Paul.

So Anna has 7 books.

Hint #2

Keep the following in mind:

- Summand +summand =sum. The corresponding operation is addition.
- Minuend –subtrahend =difference. The corresponding operation is subtraction.

Hint #3

- +is the plus-sign for addition.
- -is the minus-sign for subtraction.
